4.1. Applicable Events

- 4.1.2. The meetings will be held under the General Regulations of The Motor Sports Association (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA) and these Supplementary Regulations and any written instructions that the organising club may issue for the event.

- 4.1.7. The 1st April and 14th October Anglesey sprints will use the National Course. The length of the course is approximately 1,816 yards.
- 4.1.8. 2nd April & 15th October, Anglesey will use the International Course. The length of the course is approximately 3,400 yards.

- 4.1.9. The 21st May and 3rd September Three Sisters sprints will use Course 2. The length of the course is approximately 1,250 yards.
- 4.1.10. The 30th July Three Sisters sprint will be a 2-lapper. The length of the course is approximately 1,760 yards.
- 4.1.11. The 30th September Blyton Park sprint will use the Sprint Circuit. The length of the course is approximately 2,515 yards.
- 4.1.12. All course maps are available on the Club website at <u>www.longton-dmc.co.uk</u> and will be included in the Final Instructions for each event.
- 4.1.13. Courses are all tarmac with varying lengths of straight sections.
- 4.1.14. Tyre warming is not permitted at any LDMC events.
- 4.1.15. All vehicles must comply with the MSA 2017 Technical Regulations.
- 4.1.16. Awards will be presented at the venues on the day of the event after the required verification period. If you are unable to attend the presentation of awards then please try to arrange for your award to be collected on your behalf. Due to the fragility of the awards LDMC will not deliver them.
- 4.1.17. The awards for each event are as follows;

Fastest Time of Day 1st in Class (subject to 3 entries) 2nd in Class (subject to 5 entries) 3rd in Class (subject to 7 entries) 4th in Class (subject to 10 entries) Best LDMC Member Best Novice

- 4.1.18. No competitor may win more than two meeting awards with one car. Competitors who win an award such as FTD will receive this in lieu of their class award and the remaining competitors will 'move up' to replace him/her i.e. 2nd moves to 1st; 3rd moves to 2nd, etc.
- 4.1.19. Many drivers do not complete the section on the entry form showing Novice/Expert details. Unless this section is completed it will be assumed that the driver concerned is an Expert. A Novice is defined as a competitor who has been competing for three years or less and has not won a class award (or FTD) at a sprint or hillclimb speed event. Competitors may nominate themselves as an Expert if they do not wish to be considered as a Novice even if the above definition applies to them.
- 4.1.20. Each event's Entry List opens on the publication of these Supplementary Regulations and will close 3 days prior to the event date in accordance with MSA Yearbook D20.1. A late entry fee of £10 will apply for entries made within 11 days of the closing date.

4.1.21. The Entry Fees are;

- 4.1.22. All entries must be made either online at <u>www.longton-dmc.co.uk</u> or on the official Entry Forms and be accompanied by the appropriate fee. Members of Longton & District Motor club will receive a £5 discount per event, noting that each day of an Anglesey weekend is classed as a separate event.
- 4.1.23. The Final Entry List will be published on the event notice board. All other Entry Lists prior to this shall be considered provisional.
- 4.1.24. The Entries Secretary (as noted at 4.2.3) can be contacted by email; <u>entries@longton-dmc.co.uk</u> or on 07788 885711.
- 4.1.25. The maximum number of entries for each meeting will be;

- 4.1.26. Where necessary, a reserve list of 20 names will be maintained.
- 4.1.27. In accordance with the MSA British Sprint Championship regulations we are required to prioritise those entries at the Anglesey events in October. This prioritisation closes 4 weeks before the event.
- 4.1.28. The minimum entry for each event is 60. Should this minimum not be reached the Organisers have the right to cancel the meeting.
- 4.1.29. Entries will be accepted at the Organiser's discretion.
- 4.1.30. Entry fees will be refunded in accordance with H30.1.3 (c) and H31.1.2, less a £20 administration fee if notification is given in writing on, or before, 7 days prior to the event.
- 4.1.31. Reserve entries not allowed a run will receive full refunds.

4.3. Regulations

4.3.1. The Programme for the Meetings will be determined in the Final Instructions, but the following can be used as a guide;

Signing on commences	07:30 hrs
Scrutineering commences	07:30 hrs (Individual times of Scrutineering will be notified in the Final Instructions)
Drivers Briefing	A Drivers Briefing will be held prior to Practice at a time publicised in the Final Instructions. Attendance is compulsory for all drivers. Non-attendance will attract a fine in accordance with G5.3.8 and as detailed in the Final Instructions.
Anglesey Practice	10:00 hrs (Saturday), 09:30 hrs (Sunday).
Three Sisters Practice	10:00 hrs. Engines must not be started before 10:00 hrs.
Blyton Practice	10:00 hrs. Engines must not be started before 10:00 hrs.
Close of Signing On	10:30 hrs. Any competitor not signed on by this time may be excluded.

- 4.3.2. First timed runs commence at the time advised on the day by the Clerk of Course, depending on relevant circumstances. A minimum of two timed runs will be available unless special circumstances dictate otherwise. The number of timed runs will be advised on the day by the Clerk of Course depending on relevant circumstances. Where the event is a round of the British Sprint Championship, the fastest 12 competitors in the British Sprint Championship will be given one or two further timed runs as time permits.
- 4.3.3. Noise Testing will be carried out before any vehicle is allowed to practice. All vehicles must comply with MSA 2017 Yearbook; J5.17, J5.18 and chart J5.18.
- 4.3.4. Competition Car Log Books (if required) must be valid and produced if requested J2.1 & S9.1.7.
- 4.3.5. Provisional Results will be published in accordance with D26.1 as soon as possible after each run, or following the end of the event. Any competitor requiring a copy must provide a stamped, self-addressed envelope or an email address.
- 4.3.6. Any protests should be lodged in accordance with C5.2 & H35.1.6 of the MSA 2017 Yearbook.
- 4.3.7. Classes will run in Entry List order (shared cars excepting), unless otherwise directed by the Final Instructions.
- 4.3.8. Cars will start singly.
- 4.3.9. The starting signal will be lights.

- 4.3.10. The method of timing will be Electronic Class D.
- 4.3.11. The finish line will be indicated by a chequered board and/or flag.
- 4.3.12. A driver is under Starter's orders as soon as he/she is called forward to the Start Line by the Start Marshal.
- 4.3.13. Competitors are reminded that timing struts must be fitted as requirement S10.9.
- 4.3.14. Shared vehicles Cars will not be permitted to run with two sets of numbers displayed at the same time. Competitors must display their correct number. Timekeepers are not bound to allocate times for vehicles incorrectly numbered. Please pay special attention of MSA 2017 Yearbook S9.2.5 and S9.2.6.
- 4.3.15. Competitors will only be allowed to make one approach to the Start Line. If the engine stalls the car will be pushed away, restarted and pushed up to the line. Any competitor not complying with this Regulation will be excluded. The Chief Start Marshal will be Judge of Fact to adjudicate on this Regulation.
- 4.3.16. Start Line Marshals will not be available for push starts.
- 4.3.17. Artificial tyre warming devices are NOT permitted.
- 4.3.18. All refuelling must take place in the Paddock and in accordance with Final Instructions for each venue.
- 4.3.19. Drivers awarded a re-run, or cars returning for a driver change-over, must return to the holding paddock and join the rear of waiting cars.
- 4.3.20. All drivers must wear flame retardant overalls, gloves and helmets (with HANS/FHR, if applicable) <u>before leaving</u> the Paddock. Seat belts must be fastened.
- 4.3.21. Competitors will be given two Practice Runs and the opportunity to walk the course. Where the layout comprises multiple laps of the circuit then the Practice requirement may be reduced to one Run, as directed by the Clerk of Course at the Driver's Briefing prior to the start of the event.
- 4.3.22. Competitors will be identified by competition numbers as laid down by MSA Technical Regulations (J4). These numbers are NOT supplied by the Organisers.
- 4.3.23. All other General Regulations of the MSA will apply as written except for the following:

S9.2.3 – One driver may not compete in more than two cars.

4.4. Access and Camping ~ Important Notes

4.4.1. The 3-Sisters, Blyton Park and Anglesey circuits may be in use on the days prior to each event until approximately 6:00 p.m. Therefore Officials, Marshals, Competitors, or anyone else connected with the LDMC events will NOT be allowed on the circuits or in any official areas until the day's events are terminated.

- 4.4.2. Overnight camping will be allowed at Three Sisters on the night prior to the event.
- 4.4.3. Overnight camping will be allowed at Anglesey Circuit on the night prior to the each day's event. i.e. on Friday and Saturday nights.

4.5. Classes

ALL vehicles must comply with MSA General, Technical & Safety Regulations included in Sections J & S, 2017 MSA Yearbook – Definition of Classes. Relevant sections are quoted for each class.

- 4.5.2. All vehicles must comply with MSA Technical Regulations and with the specific regulations for each category/class as specified in S10. See the 2017 MSA Yearbook Section B for the definition of a Sports Car.
- 4.5.3. (All classes) Cars shall have a towing point of adequate strength at both front & rear, clearly marked by an arrow and the word "Tow" using a contrasting colour. A suitable point on the roll hoop will generally suffice for open single seater and open sports racing cars.
- 4.5.4. Equivalence factors are as per S10.3.1, S10.3.2 & S11.9.1.4, with the addition of nonforced induction diesel engines x0.714 and forced induction diesel engines x1.4

- 4.5.5. One-make clubs and championships may have their own classes subject to the numbers entered or by prior agreement. Classes may be split by capacity, age, or type/model, as appropriate.
- 4.5.6. Racing Cars manufacturer prior to 1973 and Classic Cars : Extra classes for classics may be added as required. Classes may be split by capacity, age, or type/model, as appropriate.

4.6. Clarifications for Road Going Production Cars

You must be able to produce proof of current UK Road Tax, Insurance and MOT (if age requires it) at Scrutineering. Proof of Road Tax will be via DVLA Confirmation of Vehicle Tax or a recent copy of the DVLA enquiry website (<u>www.vehicleenquiry.service.gov.uk</u>). It is the driver's responsibility to prove compliance.

Note: SA, SB & SC only: Trade plates and traders or company group insurance policies will not be accepted.

Classes SA to SC & 1A to 1C must use 2017 MSA List 1A tyres. Classes 1D to 1G & 2A to 2D may use 2017 MSA List 1B tyres. All tyres must comply with L2.3.

All road-going cars must remain in a totally road-legal condition at all times. (S11.2)

4.6.1. Classes SA, SB & SC

These classes are <u>intended</u> to attract new inexperienced drivers, using cars with very few modifications (as listed), to encourage low-cost entry into the sport. All cars running in the above classes must remain in totally road legal form at all times.

NO modifications (optional or otherwise) are permitted which are likely to improve the performance and handling of the car which must also comply with the following:

- *a) Wheels & Tyres:* Only standard* width wheel rims may be used. Tyres must be from the 2017 MSA list 1A and be Road Legal.
- b) Engine, Induction & Exhaust: The air cleaner and exhaust system must remain as production or OEM pattern replacement including catalyst if fitted.
- c) Suspension: Non-adjustable uprated dampers may be fitted.
- d) **Brakes:** An alternative or OEM pattern replacement brake friction material can be fitted, but modifications to the brake discs, drums or calipers are not permitted.
- e) Body: In the interests of safety front seats may be replaced by competition versions which must be fully trimmed, not a bare shell. Loose over-mats may be removed but the original carpets, fixed floor mats, and floor trim, etc, must remain and in their original locations. All fittings e.g. electric windows etc must be in working condition. Pyrotechnic safety devices such as airbags and seatbelt pretensioners may be disconnected or removed.
- *f) General:* The spare wheel and any mounting or cover which is not permanently fixed to the body may be removed. No other modifications, except the fitting of a roll cage, are allowed in classes SA, SB and SC.

Sports cars, kit cars, limited production cars, space framed or non-ferrous chassis construction road cars and one-off road-going cars are not permitted in Classes SA, SB and SC.

In the event of an unresolved eligibility issue, the driver of the car concerned may be required to produce within four weeks of the event in question, a manufacturer's catalogue to substantiate any queried modifications / specifications and allow championship points to stand.

Any modifications not specifically permitted are, by definition, not allowed.

* "Standard" means components that were listed in the manufacturer's price list for that model of car.

4.6.2. Classes 1A to 1G

- a) Tyres: Classes 1A to 1C must use tyres from 2017 MSA list 1A. Classes1 D to 1G may use tyres from 2017 MSA list 1B.
- *b) Exhaust systems:* must include a working catalytic converter on all cars manufactured after 31st December 1999.
- c) Brakes: Brake calipers, discs, master cylinder, shoes & pads can be modified. Carbon discs are not permitted. Modification of the brake pedal is permitted. Brake bias adjustment is allowed. (Brake balance adjusters must not be available for adjustment during running. MSA Yearbook S 10.7.2). The fitting of aftermarket pedal assemblies is not permitted. Anti-Lock braking systems can be removed but cannot be added to a vehicle that does not have one as a manufacturer specified option.
- *d)* **Suspension:** (As per S11). Non-adjustable Strut Braces across the top of the front suspension turrets are allowed but these must be removable and not welded in place.
- e) Safety; Pyrotechnic safety devices such as airbags and seatbelt pretensioners may be disconnected or removed.

4.6.3. Classes 2A – 2D

- a) Tyres must be from 2017 MSA list 1A or 1B.
- b) Exhaust systems must include a working catalytic converter on all cars manufactured after 31st December 1999.

Otherwise as specified in Section S.

4.6.4. <u>All other classes</u> as specified in Section S

General

4.6.5. **Please Note:** Scrutineers and Championship Officials reserve the right to check all roadgoing competition vehicles' taxation status via the DVLA website to ensure compliance with championship regulations. It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure that all data held by the DVLA is accurate for the vehicle being entered into competition.
