

2019 East Ayrshire Car Club Sprints

Dear Competitor

On behalf of East Ayrshire Car Club, we look forward to welcoming you to another year of sprinting at Kames Motorsport Complex.

Once again our events are rounds of the Scottish Sprint Championship, Lowland Speed Championship, Scottish Speed Championship and The Cross Border Speed Championship and we welcome competitors in all these championships.

In order to make these events fun, run both efficiently and safely there are a number of rules which we require all competitors to adhere to.

Fntrv

The preferred method of entry is online at www.eastayrshirecc.co.uk/sprints, but alternatively you may use the entry form which is at the back of these supplementary regulations. In the situation that the entry list is full, a reserve list will be run. We appreciate if you would notify any cancellations as early as possible in order that another competitor may take your place.

When You Arrive at Kames

Directions to Kames are available from our website www.eastayrshirecc.co.uk. Please use the top entry gate only (opposite the clock tower). This has been widened and set back from the road for ease of access. Please be mindful that residents of Muirkirk live on this road, so noise should be kept to a minimum (particularly if you are arriving early in the morning or late in the evening). If you are arriving on the evening before the event, please contact me in order that access to the complex may be arranged. Details on available accommodation in the area are available from our website. Alternatively, there is a caravan park less than 5 minutes walk from the complex.

The road should not be blocked by cars or trailers at any time and we also request that all generators are turned off by 10pm.

When practice starts the top entry gate will then be closed to competitors. If you arrive after this time, please use the lower entry gate and off-load your car in the trailer park, as the lower paddock will be in full use. Please contact the paddock marshal if you need assistance.

Trailers

When you arrive at the complex, please unload your car in the lower paddock and promptly remove your trailer to the trailer park. Please park your trailer around the perimeter of the trailer park and try to avoid blocking others in or stopping others from using valuable space.

Please use the trailer parking as designated and do not abandon trailers on the grass area in front of the old toilets as this space is required for campers and for access. Please check your paddock space in advance or check with the paddock marshal and park your car in the correct paddock space as quickly as possible.

Signing On

Please sign on promptly in the cabin at the end of the top paddock. Please note that your number, if possible, will be the same for both days of an EACC double-header event but there may be a requirement to change. This will be defined in the event final instructions.

The Event

The Clerk of the Course will conduct a briefing before the start.

Cars will run as per the running order published for the event. The paddock marshal will control the flow of vehicles to the start line and all drivers should be vigilant and ready to go when the paddock marshal calls them. If you are not at your vehicle ready to go at the appropriate time you may forfeit your run as time is short and events must run efficiently in order to finish on time, in accordance with MSA regulations.

Tyre warming is allowed at Kames in the allocated tyre warming area only. This will be made clear on the day.

Marshals will confirm the end of your run using a chequered flag. Please note that, when running anti-clockwise, the chequered flag will be visible at Post 2, but the finish line is a further 50m at the "Bus Stop".

When you leave the track, please go directly to your paddock place, but adhere to the paddock speed limit of 5mph as members of the public as well as other drivers are likely to be walking around.

Results will be posted at regular intervals.

After the Event

The awards will be presented in a brief presentation as soon as possible after the results are finalised.

If you are leaving the event before the end of the day please show consideration for those still competing, retrieve your trailer only when it is safe to do so, and load your car up without impeding the running of the event.

Thank you for your support. EACC look forward to you competing at Kames in 2019.

Sprint Supplementary Regulations

- East Ayrshire Car Club will organise National B Sprints on the dates defined below, at Kames Motorsport Complex.
- 2. This meetings will be held under the General Regulations of Motorsports UK (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA), and these Supplementary Regulations.
- 3. The events are rounds of the following 2019 championships:

- 4. The event is open to all fully elected members of clubs affiliated to the Scottish Association of Motorsports Clubs and competitors registered in the championships listed above. All competitors must produce a valid club membership card and Motorsports UK competition licence at signing on
- 5. All competitors and vehicles must comply with Motorsports UK Common Regulations for Competitors and Specific Regulations for Sprints as set out in the MSA yearbook sections H to L and S, the 2019 Scottish Sprint Championship regulations or the 2019 Lowlands Speed Championship regulations.
- 6. It is anticipated scrutineering will commence at 08:00. All cars will be scrutineered "in-situ" and in class order. Noise testing will also be carried out at suitable points through the day.
- It is anticipated that practice will start at 09:30 with the 1st timed run at approximately 11 am. Any competitor not signed on by 10:00 may be excluded.

- 8. On Saturdays the course will be 3 clockwise laps of the circuit at approximately 2,400 metres. On Sundays the course will be 2¾ anti clockwise laps of the circuit at approximately 2,200 metres.
- Time permitting and at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course, it is intended that competitors will be offered a <u>minimum</u> of one practice and two timed runs. Details will be confirmed at the driver's briefing.
- 10. The event will consist of the following Divisions and Classes:

Road Cars

A1: Saloon Cars up to 1400cc

A2: Saloon Cars over 1400cc and up to 2000cc

A3: Saloon Cars over 2000cc

A4: Sports Cars up to 1400cc

A5: Sports Cars over 1400cc and up to 1700cc

A6: Sports Cars over 1700cc

A8: Marque Road Sports Cars

A9: MX5 Register Cars

Modified Cars

B1: Modified Saloon Cars up to 1400cc

B2: Modified Saloon Cars over 1400cc and up to 2000cc

B3: Modified Saloon Cars over 2000cc

B4: Modified Sports Cars up to 1400cc

B5: Modified Sports Cars over 1400cc and up to 1700cc

B6: Modified Sports Cars over 1700cc

Competition Cars

C0: Saloon Libre

C1: Sports Libre up to 1400cc

C2: Sports Libre over 1400cc and up to 1800cc

C3: Sports Libre over 1800cc

C4: Racing Cars up to 1100cc

C5: Racing Cars over 1100cc and up to 1600cc

C6: Racing Cars over 1600cc

Classic & Thoroughbred Cars (period defined)

D1: Classic & Thoroughbred road cars

D2: Classic & Thoroughbred modified cars

D3: Classic & Thoroughbred competition cars

Cars will run in class order and will start singly. The starting signal will be a green light. The method of timing will be electronic, with beam operated switching. The finish will be indicated by display of a chequered flag.



- 11. Competitors may walk the course prior to first practice.
- 12. Competitors will be identified as per S9.2.5. Identification numbers may be available to purchase at signing on.
- 13. The maximum entry for each meeting is 100 and the minimum is 40. The minimum for each class is 4. Should any of the above minimum figures not be reached, EACC reserve the right to amalgamate classes or cancel the event. If required, this will be defined in the event final instructions.
- 14. If requested to do so by a scrutineer, all road cars (classes A1-A9) must be able to provide the following hard copies:
 - a. valid MOT (if applicable), with the accompanying emissions certificate
 - b. valid insurance certificate
 - c. proof vehicle is currently taxed
- 15. Entries will be accepted in order of receipt.
- 16. The entry lists open upon receipt of these regulations and closes finally at noon on Sunday 31st March or Sunday 21st July 2019 respectively.
- 17. Entries must be made online at www.eastayrshirecc.co.uk/sprints or sent to the address on the entry form.
- 18. The entry fee is £85. All entries must be accompanied by the entry fee.
- 19. Entries may be refunded, at the clubs discretion if withdrawal is notified to the secretary of the meeting at least 48hrs before the closing date.
- 20. EACC reserve the right to refuse entries without giving a reason.
- 21. In the event of postponement or cancellation, attempts will be made to reorganise the event.

- 25. Any protest and appeal must be lodged in accordance with C.6.1 6.4 of the current Motorsports UK Yearbook.
- 26. In the event of an incident, red flags will be used to halt the competition as per S4. When red flags have been deployed, entitlement to a re-run will be subject to the relevant regulation in the Motorsports UK yearbook and at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course.
- 27. Please respect the paddock speed limit of 5mph and remember MOTORSPORT CAN BE DANGEROUS.



Tillicoultry Quarries Cup

An award designed to recognise the best performance over the weekend from a team of drivers from one Motorsport UK recognised club. Rules are as follows:

- Motorsport UK registered clubs may enter up to two teams, each consisting of up to 4 drivers
- No individual driver can be in more than one team.
- Drivers wishing to compete in the challenge must submit the appropriate individual entries for the events
- There is no additional fee for registering for this award
- Clubs wishing to enter the challenge must do so before the end of first practice on Saturday 27th July
- Each team can have up to 4 drivers nominated (same names for both days)
- The best 3 scores for the team on each day count towards the total
- Each drivers score is calculated as follows: (class winning time on the day / competitors best time) x10
- The result is based on total scores over both days, with interim scores being calculated after day 1. No awards are made when interim results are published
- In the event of a tie break, lowest accumulated team time (2 x 3 scoring runs) wins.
- The trophy will be awarded to the winning team at the prize giving on Sunday 28th July

I acknowledge that I understand the nature and type of the competition and the potential risk inherent with motor sport and agree to accept that risk.
- I understand that motorsport can be dangerous and accidents causing death, injury, disability and property damage can and do happen. I understand that these risks may give rise to my suffering personal injury or other loss and I acknowledge and accept these risks. In consideration of the acceptance of this entry I agree that neither any one of or any combination of the MSA and its associated clubs, the organisers, the track owners or other occupiers, the promoters and their respective officers, servants, representatives and agents (the "Parties") shall have any liability for loss or damage which may be sustained or incurred by me as a result of participation in the Event including but not limited to damage to property, economic loss, consequential loss or financial loss howsoever caused. Nothing in this clause is intended to or shall be deemed to exclude or limit liability for death or personal injury. To the fullest extent permitted by law I agree to indemnify and hold harmless each of the Parties in respect of any loss or damage whatsoever and howsoever arising from my participation in this event.
- I declare that to the best of my belief the driver(s) possess(es) the standard of competence necessary for an event of the type to which this entry relates and that the vehicle entered is suitable and roadworthy for the event having regard to the course and the speeds which will be reached'.
- If I am the Parent or Guardian of the driver 'I understand that I shall have the right to be present during any procedure being carried out under the Supplementary Regulations issued for this event and the General Regulations of the MSA.' As the Parent/Guardian 'I confirm that I have acquainted myself and the minor with the MSA General Regulations, agree to pay any appropriate charges and fees pursuant to those Regulations (to include any appendices thereto) and hereby agree to be bound by those Regulations and submit myself without reserve to the consequences resulting from those Regulations (and any subsequent alteration thereof). Further, I agree to pay as liquidated damages any fines imposed upon me up to the maxima set out in Part 3, Appendix 1.'
- Where the Parent is not present there must be a Guardian who must produce a written and signed authorisation from the Parent/Guardian to act as their representative.
- I have read and fully understood the Procedure for Control of Drugs and Alcohol as contained in the Competitors' and Officials' Yearbook Regulations H39, D35.1, G15.1.4 and have also fully familiarised myself with the information on the web sites referred to (www.ukad.org.uk and www.wada-ama.org) in particular the UK Anti-Doping Rules which have been adopted by the MSA.
